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An Ordinance

To Prohibit Prize-Fighting and the Exhibition of Fighting Pictures of Prize-Fighters.

Be it ordained by the City Council of Florida, Ala., as follows: Sec. 1.

That any person who shall engage in a prize fight, boxing match or pugilistic encounter of any kind or exhibition of the kind or exhibition, whether in public or private, within the police jurisdiction of the City of Florida, shall be guilty of a public offense and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than fifty dollars or more than \$100 dollars.

That any person who shall exhibit any moving or motion picture of any prize fight, boxing match or pugilistic encounter or contest, game or sport of the kind or description, within the police jurisdiction of the City of Florida, shall be guilty of a public offense and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than fifty dollars or more than \$100.
