These are all the heirs of John Spaight. By this deed, they divided among themselves the slaves that had been the property of John Spaight.

A. W. Spaight acknowledged his signature to this deed before Thos. G. Rainer, clerk of the County Court of Dallas Co., Ala., on 2 Feb., 1850.

Correction to item near bottom of page 23s. Robt, J. English of Dallas Co., Ala., and his wife, Georgia, another of the daughters and heirs of said John Spaight, decid.

Oil 6th Now., 1845. Alexander Anderson, and Eliza B., his wife, of Knox Co., Tenn., gave deed to Ezekiel Pickens of Dallas Co., Ala., to land in NV; of Sep. 19, Tl7, Rl1, in Dallas Co., Ala., the same tract bought by the late Joseph Anderson (then Comptroller of the U. S. Treasury) from the Govt. of the U. S., and by him conveyed to the said Alexander Anderson. Witnesses:
