1824 Elders were elected as follows,

2 Resolved unanimously  
that as a constituent part of the  
Presbytery of South Alabama  
we regret that our commissioner  
the Rev Alexander N Cunningham  
disobeyed his instructions given at  
the last meeting of presbytery &  
contained in the following resolu-  
tion. Resolved that in  
the opinion of this Presbytery  
synods alone have a constitu-  
tional right to form unite &  
dissolve presbyteries and that  
our commissioner be instructed  
to act officially to express this  
opinion at the meeting of the  
next General Assembly.

Although, at present it may  
be unnecessary to pay any more  
attention to certain evil reports  
formerly in circulation against  
our pastor - yet for the sake  
of futurity, we think it proper  
to record our unanimous  
testimony - It was reported  
that Mr. Adams and the Teacher  
of our School acted indecorously  
at the school house  
We had, at the very commencement  
of these reports every opportunity  
to know their truth or falsehood  
and we then resisted them as  
intensely false & we believed  
malicious - Months have  
expired since then, during  
which, the subject has been  
canvassed by both Mr. Adams's  
friends & enemies - We are

not fully convinced that their reports were entirely standard and intemperate and that so far as we know they are not, nor never were believed by a single member of this Church  
by order of the Session of -  
Newport Church this  
Nov<sup>r</sup> the 16<sup>th</sup> 1837.

between him & Joseph White and his wife 78 I told him I would go if they were going to try to make peace but if they were going to meet to quarrel I did not want to hear it however I did go and when they met they began to bring up charges against each other and I thought were getting very angry and I had no hope of making the matter any better between them and I left them.

David S. White examined  
he was asked by R. S. White if he did not hear Joseph White admit that he had said he was a rascal and you told Joseph White that you had understood that he had said you were a rascal and you said if he had said so you wanted him to take it back and Joseph White reply<sup>d</sup> that it was likely that he had said so and if he had he was not going to take it back the witness was then ask<sup>d</sup> if he did not hear R.
